Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
<b>What is the overall <u>deductible</u>?</b>	<b>\$5,000</b> person/ <b>\$10,000</b> family per calendar year.	Generally, you must pay all the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
<b>Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>?</b>	Yes. Well-child care, <u>preventive care</u> , routine vision exams, colonoscopy or sigmoidoscopy done in the office or outpatient facility, <u>in-network</u> independent labs, <u>in-network</u> prosthetic limbs and services subject to <u>copayments</u> are covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . <b>Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?</b>	Yes. <b>\$50</b> person/ <b>\$100</b> family per calendar year for drug card, which does not apply to Tier 1 Rx. There are no other specific <u>deductibles</u> .	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay for these services.
<b>What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u>?</b>	Health: <b>\$6,350</b> person/ <b>\$12,700</b> family per calendar year. Drug Card: <b>\$6,350</b> person/ <b>\$12,700</b> family per calendar year. The <u>In-Network</u> health and drug card <u>out-of-pocket</u> maximum amounts accumulate together.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
<b>What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>?</b>	Premiums, <u>balance-billed charges</u> , and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .

Will you pay less if you use a <b>network provider</b> ?	Yes. See <a href="http://www.wellmark.com">www.wellmark.com</a> or call 1-800-381-8596 for a list of <b>network providers</b> .	This <b>plan</b> uses a <b>provider network</b> . You will pay less if you use a <b>provider</b> in the <b>plan's network</b> . You will pay the most if you use an <b>out-of-network provider</b> , and you might receive a bill from a <b>provider</b> for the difference between the <b>provider's</b> charge and what your <b>plan</b> pays ( <b>balance billing</b> ). Be aware, your <b>network provider</b> might use an <b>out-of-network provider</b> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <b>provider</b> before you get services.
Do you need a <b>referral</b> to see a <b>specialist</b> ?	No.	You can see the <b>specialist</b> you choose without a <b>referral</b> .

### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

Minimum Essential Coverage generally includes plans, health insurance available through the Marketplace or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of Minimum Essential Coverage, you may not be eligible for the premium tax credit.

### Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.

**This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

### Peg is Having a Baby (9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

The amounts shown in the maternity claim example above are based on amounts using a single per person deductible. Some plans may actually apply a two-person or family deductible to maternity services for the mother and newborn baby.

The plan would be responsible for the other costs of these EXAMPLE covered services.
